Look carefully at the following images of abstract sculptures. Use the following ideas to jot down your first impressions.

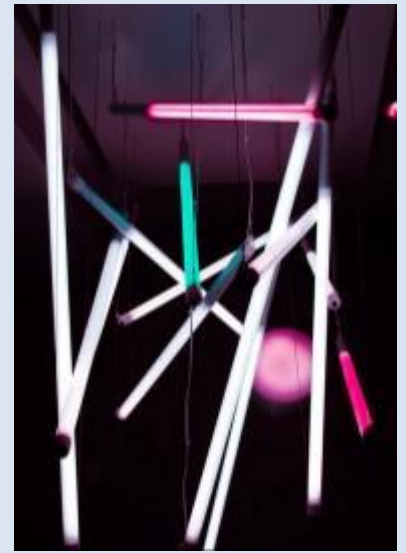
- Think about what these sculptures are or what they could represent.

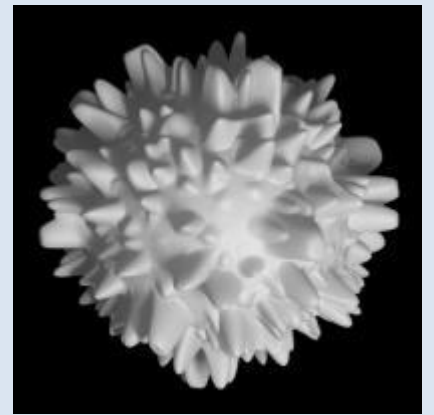
