# The English Baccalaureate

The **EBacc** is a performance measure introduced into school league tables in 2011. It is not a qualification in itself but it shows how pupils have achieved across a core of academic subjects –


English, Mathematics, two Sciences, History or Geography and a Modern Foreign Language.



# **Progress 8**

Progress 8 is a performance measure introduced into school league tables in 2016. The measure shows how much progress pupils have made in a range of subjects including the EBacc subjects and up to 3 others. This is also not a qualification in itself.

# **Sixth Form Requirements**

- Need to achieve a minimum of five grades 9 5 including English and Maths.
- Sixth Form Prospectus details individual subject requirements. Usually Grade 6 in that subject.
- e.g. Maths or French: Grade 6 or above.
- Ask subject teachers for their advice.

This is a fixed set of subjects which the majority of pupils study.






