# PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT REVIEW

Welcome to our first Personal Development review of 2026! It was a busy half term before Christmas, and here are just some of our highlights. As always, check the UVHS website and Facebook page for up to date news items.

## Year 9 Mini-Robot Workshop

On Tuesday 16th December, 50 Year 9 students took part in an exciting, **interactive STEM workshop** organised by Mrs Huddleston. Pupils were introduced to the world of off-shore wind farms and were tasked with designing a route for underwater cables from off-shore turbines to a power station and then onto a city. The teams had to think about possible obstacles and how they'd overcome them, before they then used coding to guide an 'Ozobot' along their route. The students thoroughly enjoyed the experience, they developed their soft skills and learnt more about possible careers in the STEM industry.



## Foodbank Donation

UVHS staff and students have been proud to support Barrow Foodbank for the last 10 years and would like to thank everyone who has contributed to another exceptional whole school donation. 63 overflowing crates were loaded onto a Stoller's van by 9.6c this morning and sent to add Christmas cheer to families in the Furness Peninsula. This is one of our favourite Christmas traditions in school which demonstrates our Victoria Values as we give back to our community who support us so warmly throughout the year.

Together, we donated 754kg of goodies which equated to a truly amazing **1,797 meals** worth of food!

## Anne Frank Trust

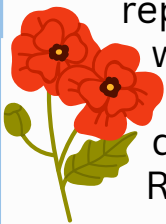

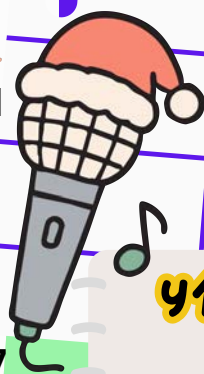
## 6TH FORM SAFETY
