# **Summer Music Concert 2022**




n Sunday 17th July UVHS Music Department enjoyed their long-overdue return to The Coronation Hall for their 2022 Summer Concert. Their last concert there had been in December 2019 – their annual concert with the Royal Marines in March 2020 was cancelled at the last minute due to Covid and then all Performing Arts' rehearsals in schools were banned until September 2021.

VHS Performing Arts has gradually been returning to public performances with the Drama Dept staging a Spring Production in April, the Swing Band returning to gigs in the region from May, the Music Dept's Chamber Concert in May and, most recently, the amazing Dance Show in The Coro on Friday 15th July, where an audience of over 400 witnessed over 120 students perform in a wide variety of dance styles from solo settings though to full-cast numbers.

The Summer Concert really was a fitting finale to the year. The Junior Band, Swing Band, Chamber Choir and Wind Band produced a spectacular set of performances showing that they have well and truly recovered from the "Covid break". Over 100 musicians (aged 11-18) presented a varied programme to the delight of a 400+ audience who, after the "Jubilee Finale" from the Wind Band gave them a standing ovation and demanded an 'encore' - which was duly given.

Richard Butler MBE (Head of Music, Performing Arts and Assistant Headteacher at UVHS) said: "Wow! That was such a fantastic effort from all the students – over half of the Wind Band have never performed here before, and most of the Junior Band and Chamber Choir were also experiencing something new. The quality of music tonight was just stunning – I am so proud of each and every one of them. It was also a fitting occasion to say farewell to our Year 13 students who have worked so hard this year to restore the culture of practical music-making in the school. I am so lucky to be able to work with such a large number of talented students year-in, year-out."

During the concert, Mr Butler also announed that the Royal Marines will be returning to share the stage with the UVHS Wind Band in a joint concert on Saturday 4th Feb, 2023. Tickets will go on sale in November.





The annual UVHS Dance show took place this year on the 15th July at the Coronation Hall. The pupils took part in the UVHS Danceathon to raise enough money so we could perform this years show at the Coronation Hall. Raising a staggering £2,500 it was clear that the students were excited to be performing again! The pupils were absolutely outstanding! The show opened with the piece created for the Brewery Dance platform and continued with pieces from all year groups. This year it was also lovely to see some of the GCSE Dance solo choreographies and A level group pieces used for examination.
