APPRENTICESHIP – Level 2 EARLY YEARS PRACTITIONER

This 15 - month apprenticeship is about working with children and babies on a day to day basis, as part of a team, and under the guidance and supervision of an Early Years Educator or teacher. You will support the planning and delivery of activities, play opportunities and educational programmes.

The Role of an Early Years Practitioner

You will interact with parents, children, colleagues and other professionals. You will support the observation and assessment of children and assist with their care such as teeth, skin, hair, feeding, changing nappies and toileting under the direction of a more senior member of staff. You will have a responsibility to ensure you recognise when a child is in danger or at risk of serious harm or abuse.

On-Programme Assessment

You will attend workshops every two weeks to gain the underpinning knowledge required for your apprenticeship. You will be assessed throughout your course to ensure you are developing the required knowledge, skills and behaviours and we will help you develop a portfolio of evidence. When you, your employer and assessor think you are ready you will be entered for your final assessments.

End Point Assessment

Your End Point Assessment will take place after 12 months once you have completed your portfolio of evidence and achieved your Early Years Practitioner Qualification, and, Maths and English at Level 2.

You will need to pass 2 assessments:

Professional Discussion - 90 minutes to discuss your portfolio of evidence

Knowledge Test – 40 multiple choice questions

You will be awarded a Distinction, Pass or Fail
