Our School

Ulverston Victoria High School is a happy and thriving 11-18 school and sixth form and is at the **heart of the community** in the picturesque South Lakeland market town of Ulverston.

In our last full Ofsted Inspection (2013) we achieved a good judgement with outstanding features for the behaviour and safety of our students and the leadership and management of our school. The recent short inspection (September 2018) confirmed the good quality of education has been maintained.

A multi-million pound refurbishment was completed in 2015 which resulted in new and improved facilities in several areas - a fantastic Sixth Form Common Room and a new Resource Area, a superb new Cloister Corridor, improved accommodation for the Special Educational Needs Department, refurbished Science facilities and Art rooms, three modern Maths rooms and a new Engagement Centre.

These improvements to UVHS mean that we now have the facilities that match our true potential.



With over 1200 students on roll, including more than 250 in our sixth form, we are in a position to offer a wide GCSE and A Level curriculum with specialist teachers and equipment in every area.

One of the major strengths of our school is our outstanding pastoral care and student welfare structure. Our students are supported by form tutors and pastoral heads of year. We also have access to other external support agencies. **Behaviour** and **attendance** are **excellent** at UVHS and our students are highly motivated, keen and enthusiastic.

They are warm, welcoming and have a good working relationship with staff, built on mutual trust and respect.





Our Curriculum



At Key Stage 3, students in Years 7 and 8 follow a broad curriculum: English, Mathematics, Science, Computing, Geography, History, BPE (RS), Modern Languages, Design and Technology, Art, Music, Drama and Physical Education. In Year 9, students get the opportunity to begin to specialise their own curriculum and try new subjects available at GCSE.

At Key Stage 4, students in Years 10 and 11 are given the choice to further focus their learning by opting for four additional subjects outside of the compulsory core of English Language, English Literature, Mathematics, Combined Science (2 GCSEs) and RS. These are selected from subjects previously experienced at Key Stage 3 such as Humanities, Modern Foreign Languages, Performing Arts and Technology. UVHS is unique in the region as students are able to specialise their own learning routes if they wish to, by studying up to three Modern Lanquages, three Performing Arts subjects or three Technology & Art subjects in their options.

Sixth Form

The Sixth Form is open to all who wish to continue their education beyond the age of 16, provided they have met the appropriate entry requirements. The majority of students in the Sixth Form pursue academic courses in preparation for their A Level examinations. Well over 80% of students gain entry to courses at universities or higher apprenticeships to continue their education.





Extra-curricular and Enrichment

Our provision offers students a diverse range of enriching opportunities, including a comprehensive programme for our talented students. We are involved in a range of national initiatives and competitions to motivate, enthuse and excite students. An enterprise and international focus is also added to our work wherever possible.

Top of the Form

Performing Arts - Music, Dance and Drama

The Music Department is outstanding and rated amongst the best in the country. Over 275 students receive weekly instrumental tuition and students are involved in numerous instrumental ensembles as well as the larger groups such as the Wind Band, Swing Band, String Orchestra, Choir and Junior Band. These perform regularly to great local, national and international acclaim and are in constant demand throughout the year for public, private and corporate engagements. UVHS also has a unique partnership with the Royal Marines Band Service resulting in annual joint concerts, work experience placements for Years 10-13 and also career opportunities.







The **Drama** Department stages an annual musical production at the Coronation Hall involving up to 100 students as well as a Primary Schools' Pantomime every December. In school there are several 'studio productions' aimed at specific year groups, as well as numerous trips to see live theatre.

Dance is a relatively new subject in school but has already seen regional success. There are regular rehearsals through the week preparing for shows, and trips throughout the year.

Physical Education and Sport

In PE, inter-house and inter-form competitions run in all sports throughout the year and the school offers an outstanding programme of extra-curricular activities, with hundreds of students participating in after-school practices throughout the week. The school successfully enters teams into local and national competitions in athletics, cross-country, football, rugby, golf, netball, hockey, cricket and tennis, and UVHS pupils have been particularly successful in orienteering (our Junior Girls won silver medals in the 2018 World Championships).





Learning Support

This operates in all years for students who have aspecial educational need. It is organised through the Learning Support Department and takes the form of support in the classroom, tutorial work and curriculum modification. The students are taught alongside their peers and arrangements for tutorial work are such that they are not prevented from participating fully in the curriculum and the social life of the school.

More Able Students

We gim to address the needs and raise the aspirations of the most able through providing support and teaching which makes their learning challenging, engaging and enables them to reach their full potential. The school's curriculum and extra-curricular activities enable the most able pupils to be challenged by applying their learning in a wide range of contexts and challenges. In addition we strive to support the development of self-reliance and independent learning.





Careers Education

All students are entitled to an ongoing progressive programme of careers guidance beginning in Year 7 and moving through to Year 13. This includes a programme of individual interviews with members of the school guidance team as well as working with the school Employability Co-ordinator. A wide range of employers support our Y10 Work Ready Day and the Y11 Careers Open Evening enables students and parents to discuss their future options with businesses and education providers.

Learning Mentors

A team of Learning Mentors provide additional support and guidance for students who are underachieving, or are experiencing difficulties. They use a variety of strategies for **removing barriers** to learning in order to promote effective participation, enhance individual learning, raise aspirations and thus enable students to achieve their **full potential**.


Our Pastoral Care

In a caring community, all teachers are concerned with the needs of the individual and teaching is based upon a relationship between the teacher and the student.

Each student is a member of a tutor group. The Tutor is the first point of contact for all students each day at morning registration where announcements are made and information is given. It is the Tutor who has an overview of the **development** and **progress** of the students through their daily contact.

The tutor groups within each year come under the charge of a Pastoral Leader. It is he or she who has the overall pastoral responsibility for the general welfare and academic progress of all the students in his or her year group. It is the Pastoral Leader to whom you should write or telephone if you need to contact the school about any matter concerning your son or daughter.

Parents should send routine correspondence about illness and reasons for absence direct to the Attendance Administrator at the school. We would be grateful if parents contact school before 9.30am on the first morning of your child's absence and each subsequent day.



Home Links

Throughout the year we have Parents' Evenings where, during individual interviews with staff, students' progress is discussed. In addition, on one occasion each term, we will send home a Progress Review for every student that will outline their target grades and measure the progress made towards achieving those targets. Also included will be students' Attitude to Learning grades which will indicate the levels of work in lessons and at home.

Uniform

All our students from Year 7 to Year 11 have to wear a designated school uniform. We feel that a uniform is an integral part of school life and is necessary to maintain high and equitable standards. School uniform policy is strictly enforced and we ask all our parents to support us in this respect.



Catering

The school uses a system of 'cashless catering'. We provide healthy well-balanced meals of a very high quality at good prices and the majority of our students stay for school meals. We also offer breakfast at the start of the school day and a mid-morning service.

No students in Year 7, 8, 9 or 10 are allowed to leave the school premises without permission. Parents are requested to notify their child's Tutor in writing if they wish their son or daughter to go home for lunch or in the event of any special arrangements for the midday break. A 'lunch pass' is issued by the Pastoral Leader in response to these written requests.

A photographic lunch pass is issued to students in Year 11 after they have signed a contract agreement with the school. All our ICT suites are open for student use at lunchtimes.

School Library

We are proud of our large state-of-the-art school library which is equipped with a wide range of books, ICT facilities and up to date newspapers and periodicals to support the curriculum, and also to inspire and encourage the habit of reading for both information and pleasure.

Being attractively and comfortably furnished, a pleasant environment conducive to quiet study has been created - a facility which Sixth Form students in particular appreciate.

The library is staffed at all times by a fully qualified librarian and assistant librarian, making maximum access possible to this excellent facility. Researching, browsing, reading and borrowing all contribute to the total learning experience of each student.

Senior Students

In the final half year of Year 10 and throughout Year 11 students have the opportunity to become 'Senior Students'. To achieve this status, students must demonstrate high standards of attendance, punctuality, behaviour, effort and endeavour. The school's Personal Reference underpins students' applications. All applicants must complete an application form and are then invited to a formal interview with a senior member of staff. If they are successful they are awarded the coveted 'Wolf Tie'. Senior students serve as role models to the younger students and their peers and help out in school in a variety of ways, such as manning reception during Parents' Evenings. The award promotes leadership and British values, supporting the school's Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural (SMSC) education and supports our excellence agenda.



Peer Mentors

An important aspect of secondary education for older students is accepting additional responsibilities. This helps develop characteristics of **self-discipline**, **trust** and **reliability**. To help foster this, a number of students have been trained in listening and befriending skills. These students operate a peer mentor service where any students experiencing difficulties with friendships and relationships can discuss the problem and be given some guidance to resolve the situation.

School Parliament

We have a thriving and active School Parliament which is a democratically elected body of students from Year 7 to Year 11. The Parliament meets each half term to discuss the development of the school and **key issues** affecting students. There are smaller sub-groups working on a number of issues including charity fundraising and an ecocommittee. For all new teaching appointments, candidates are interviewed by a student panel.

Transition from Primary School

At UVHS, we recognise that the move from primary school to secondary school can be a stressful time for both pupils and parents alike, therefore we have a transition process that aims to promote the happiness and safety of every single student throughout this journey and, indeed, throughout their entire time at the school.

We have very close links with all of our feeder primary schools across a wide geographical area and, through many varied activities have already started getting to know most students by the beginning of Year 6.

The **Primary Transition Co-ordinator** makes several visits to each primary school, observing pupils at work, helping them out in lessons, and generally becoming more familiar with each child's abilities and needs.

Our **SEND Lead** is also in all the schools attending meetings and assisting with the writing of individual education plans where necessary, and the **Engagement Centre** goes into schools to work with those students who may require additional emotional and/or social support through transition.

Towards the end of Year 6, every student is visited in their school to talk about moving up to UVHS, and we also host interviews for every child and their parent(s) to discuss any worries that may still exist, as well as go through the school's expectations and requirements.

Finally, as with all schools in the Furness area, there are two transition days in July for pupils to become even more familiar with the school and start making new friends, all ready for a fresh start in September!
